

HOW DOES PLAN INTERNATIONAL EGUADOR RESPOND TO GOVID-19?

Reduce the impact of the COVID-19 crisis in coordination with humanitarian actors, public and private sector, through prevention and humanitarian assistance for the most vulnerable communities, including migrants, refugees, and displaced individuals, prioritizing women and girls. Estimated scope: 455,988 people.



Provide access to:

Prevention and response to violence, especially:

- Delivery of 36,000 food kits and hygiene supplies to 274,000 people in 530 communities.
- Support the Ministry of Education on training for parents on teen pregnancy prevention and production of educational material to strengthen the educational system.
- Delivery of 98,000 educational guides for children of 12 indigenous nationalities as part of the project "Building Resilient **Educational Communities in Ecuador".**
- Delivery of cash to 3,860 migrants and refugees.
- Reactivation of family orchards with the delivery of garden kits and seeds to 775 families from 29 communities in the provinces of Loja and Santa Elena.
- Development of emotional care workshops to promote the mental health of 225 health professionals.
- Delivery of 203 scholarships to girls and boys in the provinces of Loja and Santa Elena.



Advise to 200 young girls from the Girls' Movement through 20 online sessions to develop a digital strategy and provide tools to respond and face situations of violence, which in turn contributes to closing the digital gap. Within the strategy, 60 communication products were developed.

 Dissemination of key protection messages through social networks and the media, including over 40 community radio stations, reaching over 250,000 people.

Strengthen community-based protection mechanisms for the prevention of violence against girls during isolation.



Development of entrepreneurships led by women for the economic and social recovery of their families

- Donation of supplies to entrepreneur women to tailor 30,000 face masks in the provinces of Guayas and Los Ríos.
- Delivery of machinery to a total of 300 women and men from 12 communities in the province of Loja to promote economic empowerment.
- Training about 140 people on issues of entrepreneurship and personal finances.



- Donation of US \$1.7 million to CARE, ChildFund and Plan International by the "Por Todos" (For Everyone) Fund, managed by private companies.
- Participation in Government and UN discussion tables on issues of: security, food, education, communication, logistics, water and sanitation, protection and violence prevention.
- Presentation to the National Assembly of the study developed by Plan International and the Ministry of **Education on Departments of Student Counseling as** a contribution to the reform of the Organic Law of Intercultural Education.
